Let me start with thanking you for continuing to choose to live in our 11.2 square mile community township and home to almost 49,000 people! As you read through this semi-annual edition of our Township Calendar and Leisure Services Activities Schedule you will easily see what a great township you live in. Be sure to keep this calendar for future reference and get out there and enjoy what we're doing to build a Better Redford!

In addition to the activities listed here, you should also know that Redford Township is certainly a community under construction and in a good way! In addition to the I-96 rebuild, many new businesses have opened in the township and many more have invested MILLIONS of dollars to create HUNDREDS of jobs. Last year we issued over 3875 Permits with a construction value in excess of \$17,000,000. We are definitely on the right track!

Thurston High School was recently named in the top 100 schools in the nation for the second consecutive year and Redford Union High School was given the Redford 30 Cup to recognize their students who received 30 on their SAT's. The Historic Commission recently partnered with South Redford Schools to repurpose a vacant and blighted school as the new headquarters of the Historic Commission. Be sure to check them out on Berwyn just south of Schoolcraft.

Last year we were faced with a five year deficit in excess of \$10,000,000 when more than 80 people volunteered to work on a long term plan to ensure the fiscal sustainability of the township. The result was a unanimously approved balanced budget for Fiscal Year 2014/2015. This budget incorporated many cost saving and revenue generating ideas without implementing a tax increase to our people and businesses. I am looking forward to working with even more of you in these community sessions this fall. Stay tuned for dates!

Before you know it, the weather will again be frightful! Last winter we set records. This summer we set records for rain. Enough of the record setting I say!!! Please remember to remove cars from roadways when the snow falls. Not only is it unsafe for you, other drivers and your vehicle it is against ordinance if a snow emergency is called. Please keep your sidewalks cleared as well so that your neighbors can safely travel around the neighborhood.

2014 YARD WASTE PICKUP ends the first full week of December (on your regularly schedule garbage pickup day). Remember yard waste in plastic bags is not allowed and will not be picked up. Filled bags/waste cans may not exceed 35 gallon capacity size and must not weigh more than 45 pounds when filled. All cans must have 2 handles on the outside or they will not be emptied. We do not accept straw, hay, apples, logs, tree stumps, dirt, rocks or sod. Landscape companies are responsible for disposing of their own yard waste.



WATER DISCOLORATION

occurs when there is a main break or a hydrant is opened. Sediments in the lines are stirred up and require several hours to settle. Do not use your hot water until you are sure the water is clear, as this will draw the sediments into your hot water tank and may stain your laundry. Instead, periodically run a cold water faucet at the lowest point in your house (usually the basement) for 3-5 minutes until the cold water is running clear. If discoloration continues call the Redford Water Department 313-387-2670. Hydrant flushing (Sept-Nov) will cause discoloration also.

REDFORD TOWNSHIP / REPUBLIC SERVICES OF SE MICHIGAN Guidelines for Refuse, Recycling Yard Waste & Large or Bulky Items Collection

The Charter Township of Redford in cooperation with Republic Waste SE Michigan – Allied Waste Division is proud to provide your refuse, recycling, yard waste & large bulky item collections. Please read these guidelines carefully and keep them handy as they will answer many questions about the various types of collections. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in your refuse, recycling, yard waste or large/bulky items not being picked up.

Refuse must be in a watertight can with lid & outside handles or in a tied refuse bag. Residents must supply their own cans & bags which may not exceed 35 gallon capacity size & must not weigh more than 45 pounds when filled. Anything placed in 95 gallon wheeled carts or in cans without outside handles is not acceptable & will not be picked up. Do not place refuse, yard waste or recyclables in cardboard boxes. Limit of 12 cans or bags of refuse per week. There is not a limit for yard waste.

Set out refuse cans, bags, recyclables, yard waste & large or bulky items no earlier than 6:00pm the night before collection or no later than 6:00am the morning of collection.

Set refuse containers, recycle bins & yard waste adjacent to the street next to the driveway but not in the street. Set refuse 5 feet away from yard waste or recycling. All containers must be removed from the curb the evening of your collection day or you may receive an ordinance violation ticket.

Items not collected for disposal: auto parts, tires, building or demo materials, contractor's debris, concrete, bricks, dirt, dead animals or hazardous materials (paint, chemicals, fluorescent bulbs, etc). Residents may be able to dispose of unacceptable items at the Canton Landfill (734) 397-2623. Call for details & current disposal fees.

For problems with trash, recycling or yard waste pickup contact the Customer Service office of Republic Services at (877) 264-5544. If your complaint is not resolved within 48 hours, then contact Redford's Public Services Department at (313) 387-2641.

Place recyclables in an 18 gallon capacity recycle bin. A single stream sorting center is used so you do not need to separate your recyclables. See chart below for acceptable items. Recycle bins may be purchased for a small fee (currently \$10) at the Public Services Bldg, 12200 Beech Daly or hardware/home retail stores. You may use your own bin but it must be an 18 gallon size & clearly marked "recyclables" on the outside of container. If "occasionally" you have more than your bin will hold you may place them in a clear plastic bag & set it next to you bin. ***Please rinse/clean/empty items before placing into recycle bin.*

HOLIDAY GARBAGE SCHEDULES. Collections will not be made on the following legal holidays when they occur on a weekday (Monday - Friday):

New Year's Day | Memorial Day | 4th of July | Labor Day | Thanksgiving Day | Christmas Day

When one of the above legal holidays occurs on a weekday, collection for the remaining days of the week will be delayed by one (1) day with the Friday collection being made on Saturday. Any changes to the holiday schedule will be posted on cable TV, the Central Maintenance phone line 313-387-2690 and the Twp website www.redfordtwp.com.

LARGE OR BULKY ITEMS (furniture, carpet, mattress/box springs, appliances, metals or other household furnishings). The current contract (thru 6/30/17) with Republic Services allows residents to put out two (2) large or bulky items per week for pickup with weekly refuse at no charge. No appointment is needed. Carpet or padding must be cut into rolls no wider than 3 feet & tied or taped. Doors, counter tops & fences will be taken but must be cut down to sizes no larger than 4ft by 4ft prior to placing at the road. Freezers, refrigerators, air conditioners & dehumidifiers must have the freon reclaimed (by a licensed heating/cooling specialist) and a certification sticker placed on them as required by Federal law before putting out for pickup. The doors must also be removed for safety reasons. For alternatives call the Redford Township Public Services office for referral ph #s of metal scrap haulers who will pick up the appliance & reclaim the freon at no charge. Some stores will take your old appliance when you buy a new one. **Unacceptable items for pick up:** auto parts, tires, large picture windows, concrete, hazardous materials, building/ construction/contractor materials such as lumber, trim, drywall, ceiling, floor tiles, landscape timbers or blocks. Residents may dispose of unacceptable items at the **Canton Landfill (734) 397-2623**. Call for details & current disposal fees.

YARD WASTE INCLUDES LAWN CLIPPINGS, LEAVES, FLOWERS & BUSH CLIPPINGS. Yard waste must be placed in brown paper yard waste bags which residents may purchase at local hardware & large retail stores, or it may be placed in a refuse container no larger than 35 gallon capacity size with outside handles & clearly marked "Yard Waste". Bags or containers may not weigh more than 45 lbs when filled & should be set 5 feet away from other containers. Stumps, logs & root balls are not acceptable as yard waste under any circumstance. **Yard waste is only picked up beginning the first full week of April and ends the second Friday of December on your scheduled refuse collection day. For 2014 collection begins week of April 7.**

BRANCHES & SHRUBS. Residents may put at the road on trash day up to four (4) bundles of branches for pickup at one time with yard waste. Branches must be less than 1½" in diameter, cut into lengths of no more than 4 feet and tied into bundles weighing no more than 45 lbs each. They may also be placed in yard waste bags or cans. Stumps, logs & root balls are not acceptable. Tree & landscape contractors are responsible for removing all materials as a result of their work.

Public Services



Have you cleaned the leaves out of your ditch or off the storm drains in your street?

The Water & Sewer Department reminds residents that the storm drains, catch basins and ditches must be kept clean, especially when the trees begin to lose their leaves in the fall. Your assistance in keeping the storm drains and ditches clean will also prevent flooding of neighborhood streets during heavy rains and snow melt periods. Also, any water that flows into the storm drains and ditches goes thru the storm water system underneath the Township and then directly (untreated) into the local Rouge River. If you witness an illicit discharge into the storm water system, contact the Wayne County Dept. of Environment's 24 hour Hotline at (888) 223-2363 or the Redford Water & Sewer Dept. at (313) 387-2670.



Why do we flush the fire hydrants every fall?

As part of an annual maintenance program, the Fire Department flushes fire hydrants in a different section of the Township every year during the months of September & October (weekdays only). Information on specific areas where flushing will occur will be posted in the "Redford Observer" newspaper, on Brighthouse Channel 8, WOW Channel 10, AT&T U-verse Channel 99 and the Township website at www.redfordtwp.com. Maintenance is performed to insure proper pressure at each hydrant and to determine whether a repair may be needed.

Water customers may experience discolored water when your area is being flushed (or during a water main break). During this time period your water service may be affected even when hydrants are being flushed several blocks away. The discoloration does not affect the water quality and is a result of stirred up sediments in the water mains. It may take several hours for the stirred up sediments to clear. Do not run your hot water during this time as this will draw the discolored water into your hot water tank and may stain your clothes if you are doing laundry. Instead, periodically run a cold water faucet at the lowest point in your house for 3-5 minutes. If the water is still discolored, wait 1-2 hours and then try running the cold water again to see if it is clear. Prolonged problems should be reported to the Water Department by calling (313) 387-2670.



How long after a snowfall must sidewalks be cleared?

The occupant of every lot or parcel of land adjoining any sidewalk (or the owner of such lot or parcel of land if unoccupied) is responsible for clearing ice or snow from sidewalks within 24 hours of its accumulation for commercial districts and within 72 hours for residential districts. Owners found in violation will be ticketed for the first violation and each subsequent violation thereafter. Complaints regarding snow or ice covered walks may be reported to the Building & Ordinance Department at the "Pride Hotline" (313) 387-2604 or by sending an email to pride@redfordtwp.com. We must have the address of the violation, as well as your name and phone number should we need to contact you for additional information.



Is the meter reading box on the outside of your home easily accessible for our meter readers?

Residents and business owners are asked to keep the snow or ice cleared from the area surrounding your water meter reading box on the outside of your home or business so that Water Department meter readers have safe access during the winter months. If you are not able to safely get to the reading box, neither can our employees and it may result in your water bill being estimated.



Do you have water lines or a water meter in your home in unheated areas during the winter?

Unheated areas are usually a crawl space, attic, garage or basement. In the kitchen or bathroom areas you may need to open cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the pipes or meter. If you go away for the winter months leave the heat on in your home and do not set it any lower than 55°F. Repairs to frozen and burst pipes can be very costly and will greatly increase your water bill if water continues to flow because of burst pipes. If your water meter freezes due to being in an unheated area or because you have turned off your heat you are responsible for the cost of having it replaced. Also remember to drain and turn off the water to your outdoor water spigots or lawn sprinkling system.



Have you ever noticed water bubbling up out of the ground or running down the street along a curbed area?

There may be a water main break, especially during winter months when pipes in the ground shift because of freeze and thaw cycles. Contact the Water & Sewer Department at (313) 387-2670 M-F 8:30am to 4:30pm to report a possible main break and its location. After office hours or on the weekends contact the Police Department at (313) 387-2500.



Why is my drinking water sometimes cloudy?

At various times of the year we receive calls from residents wanting to know why their water is cloudy when first taken from a faucet and then clears up. Cloudy water occurs most often in the fall and winter months when the ground temperatures change and water is colder. The cloudiness is caused by tiny air bubbles in the water similar to the gas bubbles in beer and carbonated soft drinks. If you let the water sit for a while, you will notice that the bubbles rise to the top and dissipate.



Do you have a vacant home on your block?

During the winter months it is possible for water pipes in the vacant home to freeze and burst if water is still on at the home and it is unheated. Also, a water meter in an unheated area may freeze and burst if it has not been winterized. If you suspect there is a home in your area that is unheated or if you see water running out a window or door of the home write down the address and call the Water & Sewer Department at (313) 387-2670 M-F 8:30am - 4:30pm or contact the Police Department after hours or on weekends at (313) 387-2500. In addition, if you have a vacant home where the exterior of the property is not being maintained (high grass, weeds, debris) report it to the Building & Ordinance Department on the "Pride Hotline" (313) 387-2604 or by sending an email to pride@redfordtwp.com. Provide us with the address of the violation, as well as your name and phone number should we need to contact you for additional information.

REDFORD TOWNSHIP PARK RULES

Parks open from 8am-11pm

- No fireworks
- Fires permitted only in picnic grills
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times
- Owners are responsible for removal of waste
- No litter, loitering or destruction of park area or property
- Dumping of household waste prohibited
- No motor vehicles permitted in the park other than in the parking lot
- Peddling/soliciting is prohibited without a permit
- No abusive language or behavior
- Any infraction of duly-adopted park rules constitutes a misdemeanor or civil infraction and is punishable by law.

SHELTER & PICNIC AREA RESERVATIONS

Reservations: Begin March 3, 2014 (*Redford Residents / Redford Businesses*)
Begin April 1, 2014 (*Non-Residents*)

Reservations for both shelters and picnic areas must be made in person in the Leisure Services Office. Both rental fees and deposit must be paid in full at the time of sign up. Rental fee can be paid by cash, check or charge card and the deposit must be paid in cash or credit card only. Proof of residency or employment is required at the time of reservation. The person who applies for the permit is responsible for the site and shelter on the rental date.

In the event you decide not to use your picnic permit or shelter on your scheduled date, you must contact the Leisure Services Office AT LEAST 30 days prior to your scheduled rental date in order to receive a refund. Furthermore, any rentals reserved less than 30 days to your scheduled date are not eligible to receive a refund. Please note, a \$10 administrative fee will be withheld on all refunds. No rain checks will be issued.

IMPORTANT RENTAL & PICNIC INFORMATION

- Picnic permits are required for any group of 20 or more persons.
- Inflatables or Bouncers are permitted only in designated areas.
The renter is required to send the companies proof of insurance adding Redford Township no later than 2 weeks prior to the rental date.
- Grills are allowed in Township parks, however they may be no closer than 3 feet above the ground. Absolutely no table top or hibachis allowed.
All charcoal must be taken with you - do not leave coals in the park.
- Bathroom facilities located in Township parks are not left unlocked on weekends. Groups that rent picnic areas or pavilions can pick up a key no later than 4:30pm the day prior to their rental. Not all parks have bathroom facilities.
- All groups must abide by Redford Township Parks Rules and Regulations.
