**2015 YARD WASTE PICKUP** resumes the week of **April 6th** and continues thru the week of December 7th (on your regularly scheduled garbage pickup day). Remember yard waste in plastic bags is not allowed and will not be picked up. Filled bags/waste cans may not exceed 35 gallon capacity size and must not weigh more than 45 pounds when filled. All cans must have 2 handles on the outside or they will not be emptied. We do not accept straw, hay, apples, logs, tree stumps, dirt, rocks or sod. Landscape companies are responsible for disposing of their own yard waste.

**HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION:** Redford will not be holding a hazardous waste collection this year; however, Wayne County will sponsor 5 collections sites this year. Events are open to all Wayne County residents and there is no disposal cost but proof of Wayne County residency will be required. All events will take place from 8am-2pm on Saturdays. April 4th at the Romulus Civic Center; May 2nd at Flatrock Community Field; June 20th at Henry Ford Community College (Evergreen); August 15th at Westland Shopping Center; October 10th at WCCC (Downriver campus). They will also accept only the following electronics: TVs, computer CPUs & monitors, printers, scanners, keyboards & mice, copiers, fax machines and cell/house phones. They do not accept tires, microwaves, large appliances, explosives, ammunition or 55 gallon drums. For additional info call the Wayne County Resource Recovery Coordinator **734-326-3936**.

**ELECTRONICS RECYCLING COLLECTION** for Wayne County residents & small businesses will be sponsored by Redford Township and Wayne County's Public Services Departments on at the Township's Public Services Building, 12200 Beech Daly - date TBD. There is no disposal cost but proof of Wayne County residency will be required.

**TIRE DISPOSAL EVENT** (for Township residents only) is being sponsored by Redford Township and the Wayne County C.L.E.A.N. Program (County Lending Environmental Assistance to Neighborhoods) at the Township's Public Services Building, 12200 Beech Daly - date TBD. Up to seven (7) tires without rims will be accepted per resident and proof of Twp residency will be required. Tires from commercial sources will not be accepted.

**BRANCH CHIPPING SERVICE** was discontinued by the Township in April 2010. If you need chipping services, the Township suggests contacting a private tree service company for large amounts of chipping to be done. Residents may be able to dispose of a small amount of branches along with weekly yard waste pickup under certain guidelines. 

**WATER DISCOLORATION** occurs when there is a main break or a hydrant is opened. Sediments in the lines are stirred up and require several hours to settle. Do not use your hot water until you are sure the water is clear, as this will draw the sediments into your hot water tank and may stain your laundry. Instead, periodically run a cold water faucet at the lowest point in your house (usually the basement) for 3-5 minutes until the cold water is running clear. If discoloration continues call the Redford Water Department 313-387-2670. Hydrant flushing (Sept-Nov) will cause discoloration also.

### Guidelines for Refuse, Recycling Yard Waste & Large or Bulky Items Collection

The Charter Township of Redford in cooperation with Republic Waste SE Michigan – Allied Waste Division is proud to provide your refuse, recycling, yard waste & large bulky item collections. Please read these guidelines carefully and keep them handy as they will answer many questions about the various types of collections. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in your refuse, recycling, yard waste or large/bulky items not being picked up.

**Refuse must be in a watertight can with lid & outside handles or in a tied refuse bag.** Residents must supply their own cans & bags which may not exceed 35 gallon capacity size & must not weigh more than 45 pounds when filled. Anything placed in 95 gallon wheeled carts or in cans without outside handles is not acceptable & will not be picked up. Do not place refuse, yard waste or recyclables in cardboard boxes. Limit of 12 cans or bags of refuse per week. There is not a limit for yard waste.

**Set out refuse cans, bags, recyclables, yard waste & large or bulky items** no earlier than 6:00pm the night before collection or no later than 6:00am the morning of collection.

**Set refuse containers, recycle bins & yard waste adjacent to the street** next to the driveway but not in the street. Set refuse 5 feet away from yard waste or recycling. All containers must be removed from the curb the evening of your collection day or you may receive an ordinance violation ticket.

**Items not collected for disposal:** auto parts, tires, building or demo materials, contractor's debris, concrete, bricks, dirt, dead animals or hazardous materials (paint, chemicals, fluorescent bulbs, etc). Residents may be able to dispose of unacceptable items at the Canton Landfill (734) 397-2623. Call for details & current disposal fees.

**For problems with trash, recycling or yard waste pickup** contact the Customer Service office of Republic Services at (877) 264-5544. If your complaint is not resolved within 48 hours, then contact Redford's Public Services Department at (313) 387-2641.

**Place recyclables in an 18 gallon capacity recycle bin.** A single stream sorting center is used so you do not need to separate your recyclables. See chart below for acceptable items. Recycle bins may be purchased for a small fee (currently \$10) at the Public Services Bldg, 12200 Beech Daly or hardware/home retail stores. You may use your own bin but it must be an 18 gallon size & clearly marked "recyclables" on the outside of container. If "occasionally" you have more than your bin will hold you may place them in a clear plastic bag & set it next to you bin. *\*\*Please rinse/clean/empty items before placing into recycle bin.*

**LARGE OR BULKY ITEMS** (furniture, carpet, mattress/box springs, appliances, metals or other household furnishings). The current contract (thru 6/30/17) with Republic Services allows residents to put out two (2) large or bulky items per week for pickup with weekly refuse at no charge. No appointment is needed. Carpet or padding must be cut into rolls no wider than 3 feet & tied or taped. Doors, counter tops & fences will be taken but must be cut down to sizes no larger than 4ft by 4ft prior to placing at the road. Freezers, refrigerators, air conditioners & dehumidifiers must have the freon reclaimed (by a licensed heating/cooling specialist) and a certification sticker placed on them as required by Federal law before putting out for pickup. The doors must also be removed for safety reasons. For alternatives call the Redford Township Public Services office for referral ph #s of metal scrap haulers who will pick up the appliance & reclaim the freon at no charge. Some stores will take your old appliance when you buy a new one.

**Unacceptable items for pick up:** auto parts, tires, large picture windows, concrete, hazardous materials, building/ construction/contractor materials such as lumber, trim, drywall, ceiling, floor tiles, landscape timbers or blocks. Residents may dispose of unacceptable items at the **Canton Landfill (734) 397-2623**. Call for details & current disposal fees.

**YARD WASTE INCLUDES LAWN CLIPPINGS, LEAVES, FLOWERS & BUSH CLIPPINGS.** Yard waste must be placed in brown paper yard waste bags which residents may purchase at local hardware & large retail stores, or it may be placed in a refuse container no larger than 35 gallon capacity size with outside handles & clearly marked "Yard Waste". Bags or containers may not weigh more than 45 lbs when filled & should be set 5 feet away from other containers. Stumps, logs & root balls are not acceptable as yard waste under any circumstance. **Yard waste is only picked up beginning the first full week of April and ends the second Friday of December on your scheduled refuse collection day. For 2015 collection begins week of April 6.**

**BRANCHES & SHRUBS.** Residents may put at the road on trash day up to four (4) bundles of branches for pickup at one time with yard waste. Branches must be less than 1½" in diameter, cut into lengths of no more than 4 feet and tied into bundles weighing no more than 45 lbs each. They may also be placed in yard waste bags or cans. Stumps, logs & root balls are not acceptable. Tree & landscape contractors are responsible for removing all materials as a result of their work.

**Dear Water Customer,**

Redford Township's Water Department is proud of the drinking water it provides to its consumers. So that we comply with Federal requirements, we are providing you with our annual report regarding the quality of our drinking water. This report must be delivered to you by July 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.

In our report we show the source of our water, as well the 2014 testing results. It also includes important information about water as it relates to your health, useful tips for saving money on your water bills and suggestions on how you, as one of our 21,500+ water customers, can help us control our water rates by using water wisely during our peak use days in the summer months.

After viewing this report, you will see that Redford Township's water meets or exceeds all established water quality standards. If at any time there is any concern about the water supply, our Water Department will immediately notify our water consumers. As in previous years, Redford Township's Water Department continues to investigate and maintain the integrity of our water transmission system and will continue to implement methods of efficiency. We are committed to continuing to provide water that meets and exceeds Federal and State mandates, while also keeping prices for water as affordable as possible. **Where does Redford Township's drinking water come from?** Redford Township's Water Department is supplied water by the City of Detroit from the Springwells Water Treatment Plant it owns in Dearborn. The water comes from an intake near Belle Isle by the convergence of the mouth of the Detroit River and Lake St. Clair

**Detroit River Intakes Source Water Assessment.** Your source water comes from the Detroit River, situated within the Lake St. Clair, Clinton River, Detroit River, Rouge River, Ecorse River, in the U.S. and parts of the Thames River, Little River, Turkey Creek and Sydenham watersheds in Canada. The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality in partnership with the U.S. Geological Survey, the Detroit Water & Sewerage Department and the Michigan Public Health Institute performed a source water assessment in 2004 to determine the susceptibility of potential contamination. The susceptibility rating is on a seven-tiered scale from "very low" to "very high" based primarily on geologic sensitivity, water chemistry, and contaminant sources. The susceptibility of our Detroit River source water intakes were determined to be highly susceptible to potential contamination. However, all four Detroit water treatment plants that use source water from Detroit River have historically provided satisfactory treatment of this source water to meet drinking water standards. DWSD has initiated source-water protection activities that include chemical containment, spill response, and a mercury reduction program. DWSD participates in a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit discharge program and has an emergency response management plan. **How can the public participate?** We encourage public interest and participation in our community's decisions affecting our drinking water. The Redford Township Board of Trustees also serves as your Water Commission. Township Board meetings are held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of each month, unless cancelled for a holiday or other special reason, at Town Hall, 15145 Beech Daly, Redford, Michigan. The public is always welcome to attend and participate. Call the Redford Township Clerk's office at (313) 387-2750 if more specific meeting times and dates are needed.

**Health & Safety Information**

The following information is mandatory language provided by the Environmental Protection Agency regarding contaminants reasonably expected to be found in drinking water [§141.153(h)(1)(i) through (iv)].

**Drinking water**, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800) 426-4791.

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

**Microbial contaminants**, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations and wildlife.

**Inorganic contaminants**, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.

**Pesticides and herbicides**, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban storm water runoff and residential uses.

**Organic chemical contaminants**, including synthetic and volatile organics, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff and septic systems.

**Radioactive contaminants**, which can be naturally occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water, which must provide the same protection for public health.

**Warning about the vulnerability of some populations to contaminants in drinking water (§151.154(a)).**

"Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than is the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791)."

**Outdoor water use done wisely will help control water rates for everyone in Redford**



The cost for water Redford purchases from the Detroit Water & Sewerage Department is partially based on how much water is used during Redford's peak use hours the previous year. Any increase in our cost is then passed on to our consumers. Peak demand during the spring and summer months is usually 5 am to 9 am and again from 5 pm into the evening. By watering your lawn, garden and flowers at times when there is less demand (between 9 am and 5 pm) you will help us keep our rates down. Also, remember to check hoses and outdoor faucets for leaks. Even a small leak in a garden hose may waste as much as 700 gallons (almost 1 unit of water) per day.

**An Explanation of the Water Quality Data Table**

The tables show the results of our water quality analyses. Every regulated contaminant that we detected in the water, even the minutest trace, is listed here. The table contains the name of each substance, the highest level allowed by regulation (MCL), the ideal goals for public health, the amount detected, the usual sources of such contamination, footnotes explaining our findings and a key to units of measurement. Definitions of MCL and MCLG are important.

**Variances and Exemptions:** State or EPA permission not to meet an MCL or a treatment technique under certain conditions. The data presented in this report is from the most recent testing done in accordance with regulations. No variances requested.

**Explanation of Violations:** (NO VIOLATIONS) Although we ran many tests, only the listed substances were found. They are all below the MCL required. The Detroit Water & Sewerage Department provides Redford Township with its water.

**Cryptosporidium Monitoring:** Cryptosporidium is a microbial pathogen found in surface water throughout the U.S. Although filtration removes Cryptosporidium, the most commonly used filtration methods cannot guarantee 100 percent removal. Our monitoring indicates the presence of these organisms in our source water. Cryptosporidium was detected once, during a twelve-month period at our Detroit River intake plants. Current test methods do not allow us to determine if the organisms are dead or if they are capable of causing disease. Ingestion of Cryptosporidium may cause cryptosporidiosis, an abdominal infection. Symptoms of infection include nausea, diarrhea, and abdominal cramps. Most healthy individuals can overcome the disease within a few weeks. However, immuno-compromised people, infants and small children, and the elderly are at greater risk of developing life-threatening illness. We encourage immuno-compromised individuals to consult their doctor regarding appropriate precautions to take to avoid infection. Cryptosporidium must be ingested to cause disease, and it may be spread through means other than drinking water.

**National Primary Drinking Water Regulation Compliance:** This report was prepared by the Redford Township Water & Sewer Department using data supplied by our water provider, the City of Detroit Water & Sewerage Department, and the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality. This report has been provided to you to ensure compliance with the Michigan Safe Drinking Water Act (1976 PA 399, as amended) by 1998 PA 56. This Act was passed to ensure compliance with the Federal Clean Water Act and the rules promulgated by the United States EPA dealing with this law. ## Health Information About Lead

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. It is possible that lead levels at your home may be higher than at other homes in the community as a result of the materials used in your home's plumbing. Redford Township is responsible for providing high quality drinking water but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. ## Monitoring & Reporting Requirements

The State & EPA require us to test our water on a regular basis to ensure its safety. In 2014 we completed lead and copper testing. We update this report annually and will also keep you informed of any problems that may occur throughout the year as they happen. ## Important Notice About Sewer Backups

In compliance with Public Act 222, be advised of the following: Any resident experiencing an overflow or backup of a sewage disposal system or storm water system should **immediately upon discovery, or in the exercise of reasonable diligence should have discovered**, contact the Water & Sewer Department at (313) 387-2670. If it is after normal business hours, you should contact the Redford Township Police Department at (313) 387-2553 and they will contact the Water & Sewer Department foreman.

You should also file a written claim with the Redford Township Water & Sewer Department, 12200 Beech Daly, Redford, MI 48239, **within 45 days of discovery of the overflow or backup**. Failure to provide the required notice will limit your rights under the law. A claim form is available by calling the Water & Sewer Department at (313) 387-2670. **PLEASE NOTE: In order for a claim to be viable, the source of the problem must be the Municipal sewer. Problems caused by your property's plumbing or in your home's sewer lead are your responsibility.**

## Are your downspouts illegally connected to the sewer system?

It is a violation of State law and Redford Township's ordinances for homeowners or businesses to have their downspouts connected to the sewer system. While your downspouts carry storm water away from your home, the problem is that when they are directly connected to the sewer system it causes all of the storm water to flow directly into our lakes and rivers which contributes to flooding, eroding banks and degradation of fish and wildlife habitat. Take a walk around the outside of your home and make sure yours are not connected. Failure to disconnect can result in fines or penalties.

## Water & Sewer Department Frequently Asked Questions

**My drinking water often looks cloudy when first taken from a faucet and then it clears up. Why is that?** Cloudy water is caused by tiny air bubbles in the water similar to the gas bubbles in beer and carbonated soft drinks. If you let it sit for a while, the bubbles will rise to the top and dissipate. Cloudy water occurs most often in the fall and winter months when the water is colder.

**What causes water to sometimes appear discolored or rusty?** In some cases, rusty or dirty water may come from the distribution system as a result of a water main break or fire hydrant use. It may take several hours for stirred up sediments to settle. In the event of a main break or disturbance, it is best to wait until the problem is fixed before running your water. Then periodically run a cold water faucet for 3-5 minutes at the lowest point in your house (usually the basement) until the water runs clear. If it is still rusty or dirty, wait 1-2 hours and then try again. **Do not run your hot water, as this will draw the discolored water into your hot water tank and may discolor clothing if you are using your washer.** Another cause of discolored water could be from rusting in galvanized pipes in home plumbing systems. Also, remember that every year, during the months of September thru November, Redford Township conducts its hydrant flushing program which may cause rusty or dirty water in areas being flushed.

**Why do I have a sewer odor in my basement?** Water that normally remains in your plumbing fixture traps or basement floor drains may have evaporated and sewer gases are entering your home. To remedy this situation, pour half a bucket of water down the floor and sink drains. Also remember to fill any shower drains in seldom used bathrooms.

**Why is the sewage charge on my bill higher than the previous bill?** The charge for sewage disposal is based on the number of units of water you are billed for. This amount will vary on each bill if your water usage also varies. If you lower your water consumption, you will also lower your sewage disposal charge. During summer months, when your water usage is higher, you will especially see higher charges for sewage disposal.

**Whose sewer is it?** The Water & Sewer Department cleans and maintains main line sanitary sewers that are generally located within the public right-of-ways. The sanitary sewer lateral line that runs from your home or building to the Township's main line is installed and maintained in its entirety by the property owner per Township ordinance.

**Who do I call to clean my sanitary sewer lead?** We recommend that you call three drain cleaner specialists to compare prices. Ask a friend if they know someone or look in the phone book. Redford Township cannot endorse any drain cleaning company. When you call, ask each of them what the minimum cost will be? How many feet of sewer cleaning this includes? How much for each additional foot? Do they offer a warranty? If so, how long and what does it include? If one bid is extremely low, you may want to ask for references (Better Business Bureau or previous customers of the company). Once they have opened up the drain, ask them to clean it with the largest cleaning tool they can safely use.

## Storm Water Information

Did you know that more than one-third of the pollution in the Rouge River and its tributaries comes from storm water runoff? As rainwater flows over land it picks up a variety of pollutants, including eroded soil, trash, fertilizers and pesticides. Automobile fluids, including motor oil, antifreeze, gasoline and brake fluid, contain trace metals and poisons that often leak from vehicles onto streets and parking lots. These pollutants may make their way into storm sewers and ultimately into our Rouge River.

Redford Township is entirely located within the Rouge River Watershed, and all creeks and streams within the community flow into the Rouge River.




Redford Township is committed to protecting water quality and is working with other communities in the Watershed to develop proactive methods of controlling water pollution. The Rouge River Watershed, in which Redford Township is located, was once considered one of the most polluted rivers in the Nation. However, great strides have been made in cleaning up the Rouge at a cost of many millions of dollars. Despite advances in technology, environmental clean-up costs continue to increase every year. Redford Township has already spent millions of dollars with many more millions to be spent. Preventing pollution is much easier and less costly to implement than trying to correct environmental damage after it has occurred. ### Tips for Saving Money on Your Water Bill

Dripping faucets, fixtures or hoses increase your water bill and cost you money. Don't waste it!	A continuous leak from a hole the size below, at 60 psi water pressure, over a 3 month period results in the waste listed:			
A dripping faucet or fixture can waste 3 gallons of water a day or a total of 1095 gallons a year. The chart at the right shows how much water can be wasted depending on the size of the leak. Currently Redford's water is billed to its consumers at a total fee of \$8.35 per unit, which includes water, sewer, CSO fees, etc. (1 unit = 748 gallons) In addition, if you lower your water consumption you will also be lowering the sewer charge on your water bill. <b>Note: Redford's water rate is subject to change on July 1<sup>st</sup> of every year.</b>		1/32"	64,000 gallons	9,850 cubic feet

### Toilet leaks, undetectable to the naked eye or human ear, can add \$25 or more to your monthly bill



This type of leak tends to get larger and cost you more the longer you wait. You can test your toilet by simply removing the cover to your tank and adding a few drops of food coloring or a dye tablet to the water. Do not flush the tank. Leave the dye in the tank for several hours (overnight if possible). If the dye appears in the toilet bowl, you have a leak! In most cases, the leak is caused by the flapper in the tank not sealing properly (A).

Other causes of the leak may be the flushing handle is stuck or the flushing arm and lift chain in the tank are not working properly (B); the water level in the tank is too high and spills into the overflow tube (C); or the float rod, ballcock and/or float ball are corroded (D). Replacement parts are available at local hardware and plumbing supply stores or consult a local plumbing professional. Remember to also check your basement toilet. Many times it is the basement toilet (which is not used often) that causes the problem.

### More ways to conserve water and reduce your bills

- Use your water meter to detect hidden leaks. First turn off all taps and appliances that use water. Write down the digital read of the water meter or note where the red dial arrow has stopped. Check it again in 30-60 minutes. If the meter's digital read has increased or the dial has moved, you have a leak somewhere.
- Repair leaky faucets, toilets, outdoor spigots, hoses, automatic sprinkler system heads/lines and set sprinklers so they are not watering the street or sidewalk.
- Adjust your lawnmower to a higher setting. A taller lawn will shade roots and holds soil moisture better than if cut shorter.
- Plant drought-resistant plants / trees
- Don't leave the water running while brushing teeth or shaving
- Limit showers to five minutes
- Install flow restrictors in showerheads and faucets
- Replace 5-gallon per flush toilets with newer low-flow toilets
- Repair all faucet leaks – even ones with "just a little drip"
- Run the washing machine and dishwasher only when fully loaded
- Instead of using a garbage disposal compost organic waste

### Do you know that

- An average person uses 50 - 100 gallons of water a day
- Flushing a low flow toilet uses 1.6 – 3.2 gallons of water
- Flushing a regular toilet uses 5 gallons of water
- The average 5 minute shower uses 25-50 gallons of water
- Washing a load of clothes can use 30-32 gallons of water
- A dishwasher load uses 9-12 gallons of water & hand washing 10-20 gallons
- Outdoor automated irrigation sprinkler systems can account for 60 percent of your water use
- Running an outdoor sprinkler for 1 hour is estimated to use 700 gallons of water which is almost 1 unit of Redford water (748 gallons)
- A case of 24 count 16.9 oz. bottles of water is the equivalent of 3.17 gallons of water and costs \$2.99 - \$4.99 a case
- One unit of Redford's water (including sewer, CSO & meter fees) is 748 gallons at a cost of \$8.35
- The sewer cost on your bill is based on how much water you use and when you use less water you will pay less for sewer charges

# Parks Information

## REDFORD TOWNSHIP PARK RULES

Parks open from 8am-11pm

- No fireworks
- Fires permitted only in picnic grills
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times
- Owners are responsible for removal of waste
- No litter, loitering or destruction of park area or property
- Dumping of household waste prohibited
- No motor vehicles permitted in the park other than in the parking lot
- Peddling/soliciting is prohibited without a permit
- No abusive language or behavior
- Any infraction of duly-adopted park rules constitutes a misdemeanor or civil infraction and is punishable by law.

## SHELTER & PICNIC AREA RESERVATIONS

**Reservations:** Begin March 2, 2015 (Redford Residents / Redford Businesses)  
Begin April 1, 2015 (Non-Residents)

Reservations for both shelters and picnic areas must be made in person in the Leisure Services Office. Both rental fees and deposit must be paid in full at the time of sign up. Rental fee can be paid by cash, check or charge card and the deposit must be paid in cash or credit card only. Proof of residency or employment is required at the time of reservation. The person who applies for the permit is responsible for the site and shelter on the rental date.

**In the event you decide not to use your picnic permit or shelter on your scheduled date, you must contact the Leisure Services Office AT LEAST 30 days prior to your scheduled rental date in order to receive a refund. Furthermore, any rentals reserved less than 30 days to your scheduled date are not eligible to receive a refund. Please note, a \$10 administrative fee will be withheld on all refunds. No rain checks will be issued.**

## IMPORTANT RENTAL & PICNIC INFORMATION

- Picnic permits are required for any group of 20 or more persons.
- Inflatables or Bouncers are permitted only in designated areas.  
The renter is required to send the companies proof of insurance adding Redford Township no later than 2 weeks prior to the rental date.
- Grills are allowed in Township parks, however they may be no closer than 3 feet above the ground. Absolutely no table top or hibachis allowed.  
All charcoal must be taken with you - do not leave coals in the park.
- Bathroom facilities located in Township parks are not left unlocked on weekends. Groups that rent picnic areas or pavilions can pick up a key no later than 4:30pm the day prior to their rental. Not all parks have bathroom facilities.
- All groups must abide by Redford Township Parks Rules and Regulations.
